Project update

Work has progressed at the Bendigo Tennis pavilion with all the internal framing now complete, and the windows installed. The four ITF courts are also complete, which includes new 500 lux lighting.

Senator Bridget McKenzie and Infrastructure and Transport Minister Darren Chester visited the site in May, to inspect the works.



Work has started on the upgrade of the additional seven courts. Fencing, temporary line marking and asphalt has been installed so that these seven courts can be used throughout winter.

The new Plexicushion prestige surface (which is the same as the Melbourne Park Tennis Centre) will be installed in spring, when the weather improves.



Project overview

The \$6M Bendigo Tennis Centre redevelopment will upgrade and expand the Centre's facilities and capacity to support local, national and international tennis in Bendigo for years to come.

Stage one of the redevelopment will see the construction of a new pavilion and car parking, and the upgrade of four courts to International Tennis Federation standards.

The pavilion will include two function rooms, a new kitchen and kiosk, public toilets, reception area, a pro shop, an administration area, accessible change rooms and toilets, and a tournament office.

Stage two will include grandstand seating for more than 400 people, upgrading and lighting another seven courts, constructing three junior Hot Shots courts, and developing further BBQ and shelter facilities.

Funding breakdown

- City of Greater Bendigo - \$1.085M
- Bendigo Tennis Association and Tennis Australia - \$600,000
- State Government - \$2.4M
- Federal Government - \$2.09M

Timeline

- New pavilion- estimated completion October 2017
- Upgrade to further seven courts- estimated completion November 2017
- Remainder of stage two works (including grandstand and three junior courts) - to start in October 2017
