UTR PTT \$25K BENDIGO

The Bendigo Regional Tennis Centre hosted the UTR PTT \$25K Bendigo Men's and Women's from December 12 to 19. The event saw players travel from all across Australia with a few international players representing New Zealand and India.

The event only required the use of the front four courts for match play and also a few practice courts at the centre, allowing the majority of our social and pennant competitions to be played at the centre which meant there was no need to use another venue, a great outcome for our local comps.


The event consisted of only singles matches, no doubles events, seeing the 20 participants in each draw being split into groups of 5 to play a round robin before being placed into the playoff rounds. The playoff rounds were single elimination and consisted of five draws of 4 players depending on the player's group finishing (1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, or 5th).

In the Women's final, New Zealander, Katherine Westbury (pictured bottom right) was victorious with a dominant 6-0, 6-0 win over fellow New Zealander, Monique Barry. Westbury took home the \$3.6k USD prize money with her unique double handed forehand and while also not dropping a single set all tournament.

In the Men's final, Jeremy Taylor (pictured bottom left) was victorious against Tomislav Papac with a straight sets 6-4, 6-2 win. The Australian and University of Memphis player dropped 1 set all tournament which saw him take home the \$3.6k USD prize money.

The 2023 Inter-Regional Country Championships Victoria was the 67th edition of the tournament held at the Yarrawonga Lawn Tennis Club on January 6 to 8 and had players represent Loddon Campaspe, Goulburn, Barwon, South West, Wimmera, Mornington Peninsula, Central Highlands, and East Gippsland.

258 players descended to the BRTC from across the state and beyond the Victorian border to compete in the final Zone Series event in Bendigo for 2022.

Olivia Symons won the Womens Open Band 1 event with a 6-1, 6-4 win over Darcy Parke in the final. Olivia then went on to play in the Bendigo UTR Pro Tour Tennis event the following week in Bendigo.


The Mens Open Band 1 final saw Jackson Varney 6-2, 5-3 up over James Elia before the rain halted play and saw the match abandoned.

Castlemaine's Lewis Murray won the 16/u Boys Singles event with a 6-3, 6-4 win in the final. The Castlemaine duo of Lewis and Jacob Juriansz were facing off with Jamie Windust of South Bendigo and Strathdale Park with his partner Jason Wirth but rain abandoned the 16/u Boys Doubles final.

The Alicia Molik Cup, Tennis Victoria's premier 12 & under teams event, was held at the Kooyong Lawn Tennis Club in early December, representing Team Loddon Campaspe Region was Callum Fyffe (Spring Gully TC), Carlo Gamboa (South Bendigo TC), Rielle Armstrong (Spring Gully TC) and Willow Kelly (Spring Gully TC).


Playing singles and mixed doubles in hot conditions on Kooyong's clay courts against 16 teams of the best from around the state, our team of Carlo Gamboa, Callum Fyffe, Willow Kelly and Rielle Armstrong started with two 4 sets to 2 losses in tough battles against Melbourne powerhouses NEJTA and Waverley.

They followed with strong wins against Wimmera (6-0), Western Region TA (4-2) and Mornington Peninsula (5-1).

After another tight 4-2 loss to Moorabbin, Callum's singles win in the last match on court gave Loddon Campaspe a win over North Suburban JTA (3-3, on countback) which secured 7th place of the 17 regions, the highest of the eight non-metro regions.

Other highlights included Rielle remaining undefeated across six singles matches, Willow winning six of seven singles (including one incredible comeback win from 2-5 15-40), and Carlo's tenacious efforts against some of the strongest boys from Melbourne.

The players showed amazing attitudes and team spirit on and off the court. Congratulations to all involved!

Sustained Operations Project update

The FGM Sustained Operations Project team, together with lead consultants AECOM are preparing the documentation required for the EES to adequately address the scoping requirements.

STEP 1

Identify which environmental effects are to be assessed

The scoping requirements outline the matters to be addressed in the EES and includes the assessment of specific environmental effects as detailed below:

ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS



Resource development



Biodiversity and ecological values



Water resources & environmental values



Cultural heritage



Amenity, socio-economic and land use

STEP 2

Undertake technical studies

In order to meet the scoping requirements of the EES, the following technical studies are being undertaken:

- 1. Aboriginal cultural heritage impact assessment
- 2. Historic heritage impact assessment
- 3. Air quality / Greenhouse gas emissions impact assessments
- 4. Ecology impact assessment
- 5. Geotechnical impact assessment
- 6. Groundwater impact assessment
- 7. Ground vibration impact assessment

- 8. Landscape and visual impact assessment
- 9. Land use planning impact assessment
- 10. Noise impact assessment
- 11. Surface water impact assessment
- 12. Traffic impact assessment
- 13. Social impact assessment
- 14. Economic impact assessment

While the scoping requirements are intended to cover all relevant matters, the EES will also need to address other issues that emerge during the EES investigations, especially potential impacts and environmental issues relevant to statutory decisions that will be informed by the assessment.

STEP 3

Public review / exhibition

Public exhibition

Once the Minister is satisfied that the EES adequately addresses the scoping requirements, it is released for public comment – or public exhibition – for a period of approximately 30 business days (as per DELWP requirements).

Submissions

The public exhibition period allows members of the public to review the EES and provide written submissions on the project to Planning Panels Victoria. These submissions inform the panel in making its recommendations to the Minister for Planning and are a key opportunity for stakeholders to provide feedback on the impacts of the project.

Inquiry

The Minister may appoint an inquiry to evaluate the effects of the project, having regard to the EES studies and public submissions. The inquiry may take one of three forms (depending on the complexity of the issues):

- > A desktop review of written submissions
- > A conference of submitters and review of submissions
- > A formal hearing, where the proponent and submitters are invited to speak and present expert witnesses.

It is anticipated that a hearing will be held for this project.

WE ARE CURRENTLY HERE

Final scoping requirements were issued by the Minister for Planning in September 2022. These provided the final scoping for the EES. The FGM Sustained Operations Project team, together with lead consultants AECOM are now preparing the required documentation.


GIANT SUMMER OF TENNIS
